

Gary attended the University of Missouri at Columbia, majoring in Agriculture and Education. Upon graduation, he moved to Alton, Missouri and taught Vocational Agriculture for six years. Over time, he became fascinated with the art of auctioneering. His interest eventually led him to change



career paths. Gary has been a successful auctioneer for the past 50 years, selling cattle nationwide. He was also a



partner at Blansets sale barn in Ozark, MO for 20 years. His deep-rooted interest in helping people and his love for the dairy cow have always been evident in his dealings from the auction block. Over the years Gary has had some very interesting experiences, those of which include an auction he sold at South Fork where all the cast of the hit show "Dallas" were in attendance, including "JR" and "Bobby".

Gary spent several years team roping, which was his main passion until a couple of his friends invited him to a penning in Guthrie, OK. That was in the early 90's and the start of a 32-year adventure. In later years Gary went back to Guthrie and won Reserve Champion, which was one of his most cherished wins.

His brother, Jerry, owned the NLA arena in Nixa, MO where many friends from the surrounding towns and nearby states would come to team pen. Kim Hemphill frequently brought Niki and Tori to Jerry's arena over the summer to practice. Both Estes brothers were very active in the MOTPA and USTPA. Jerry produced several USTPA shows at his arena and Gary won several state championships and was a member of the MOTPA board.

Gary has won many buckles, saddles and various prizes in USTPA and several AQHA world titles, but his greatest joy has been watching many of the people who were just kids back when he started grow into accomplished riders. One of Gary's most treasured memories is Hoss Frank bringing
